Renovation Royal Academy of Art December 2018 – May 2020

The academy building on the Prinsessegracht 4 was constructed in 1938. Architects J.H. Plantenga (engineer), J.W.E. Buijs and J.B. Lürsen designed this building as a monument of modernism that corresponded with the new educational process under the influence of, amongst others, the Bauhaus movement.

The renovation is aimed at cleaning and repairing the concrete and granito parts of the building, repairing of the masonry and the jointing, replacing of the windows and wrought-iron

frames, and restoring the tile-work inside the academy. After completion the building will be more sustainable, leaving it in pristine condition for the coming years!

Please note that the Interior Architecture & Furniture Design department (IAFD) has temporarily moved to the Helena Van Doeverenplantsoen 3 in The Hague. The Textile & Fashion department has temporarily moved to the IAFD class rooms.

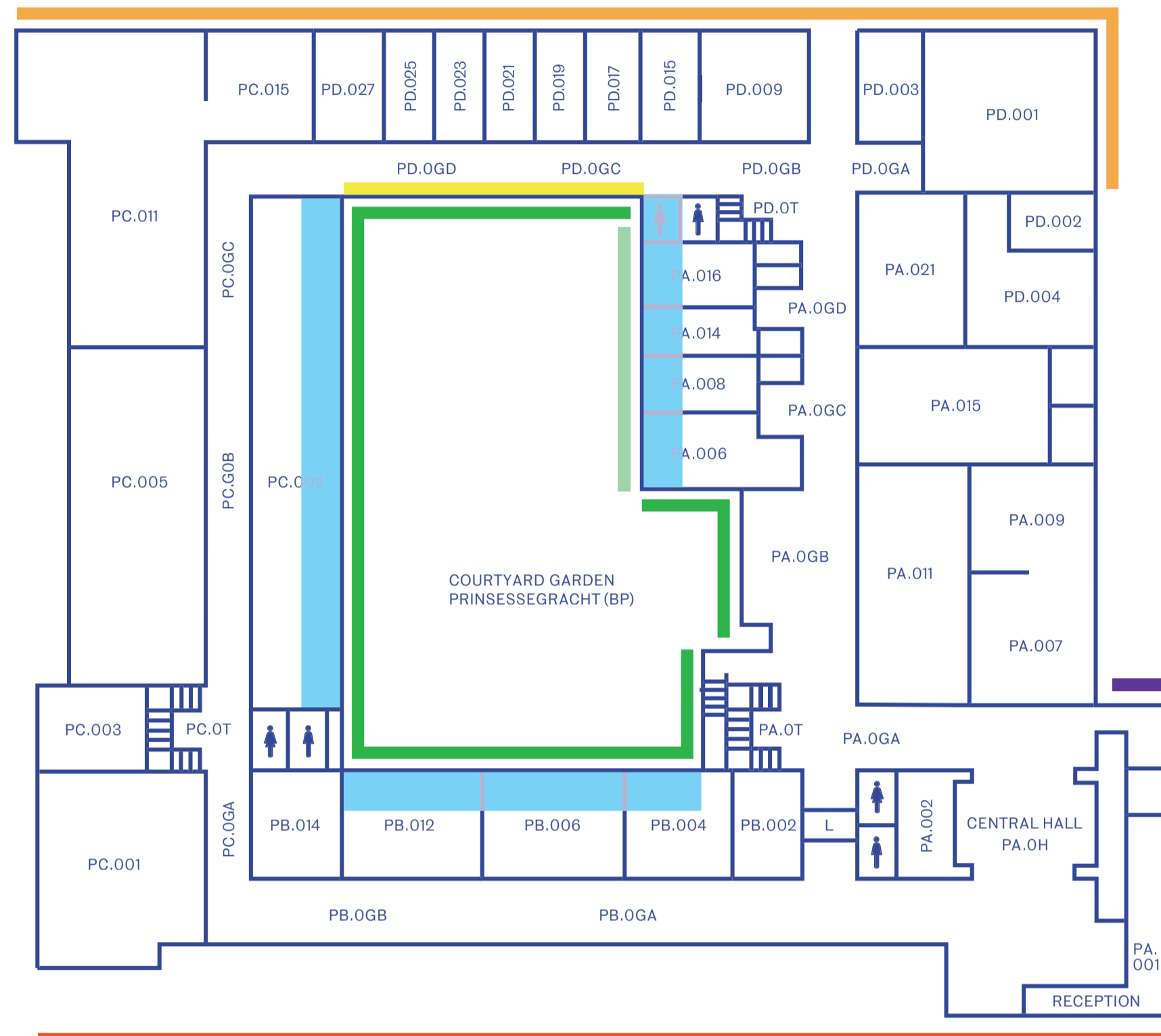

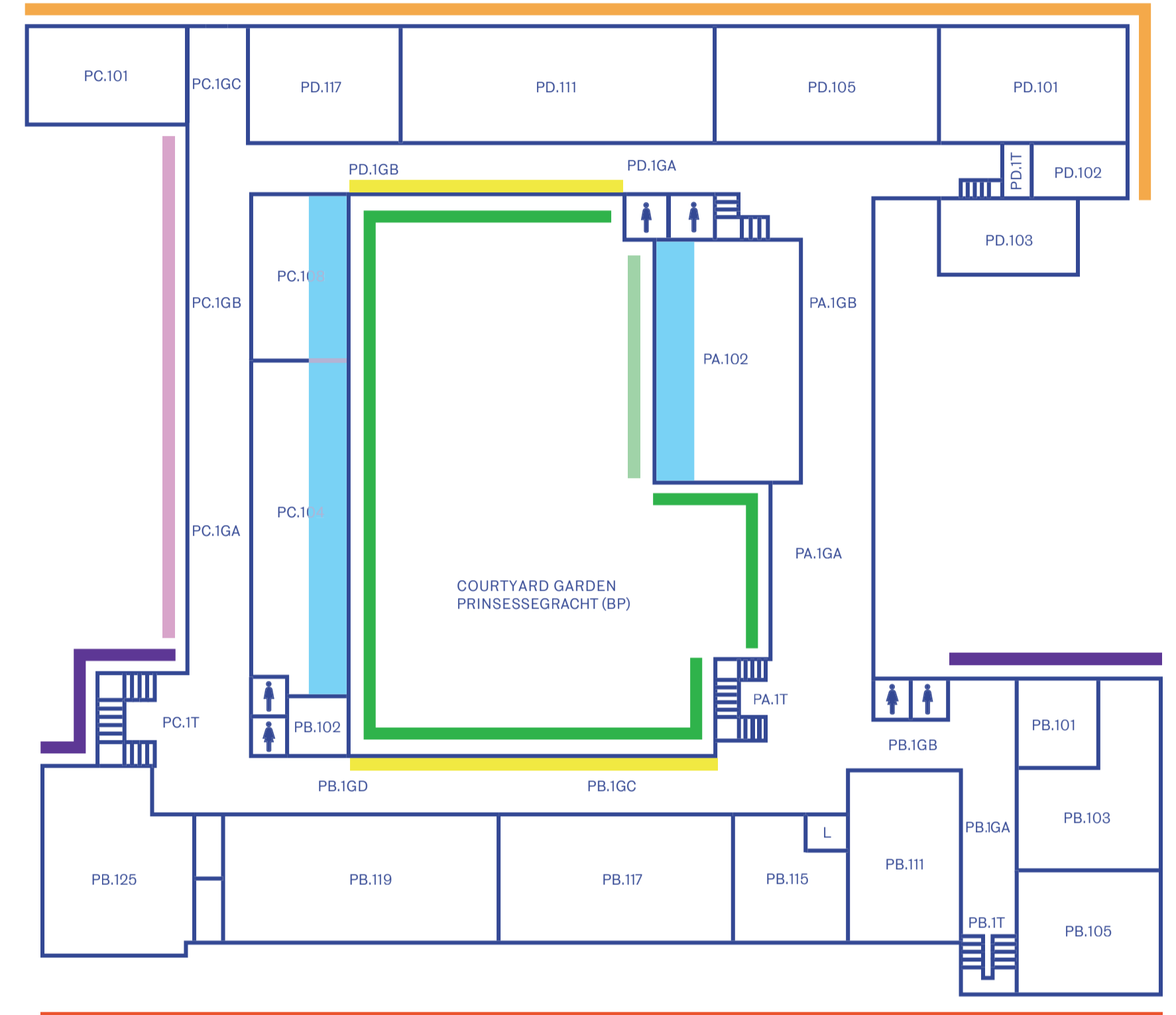

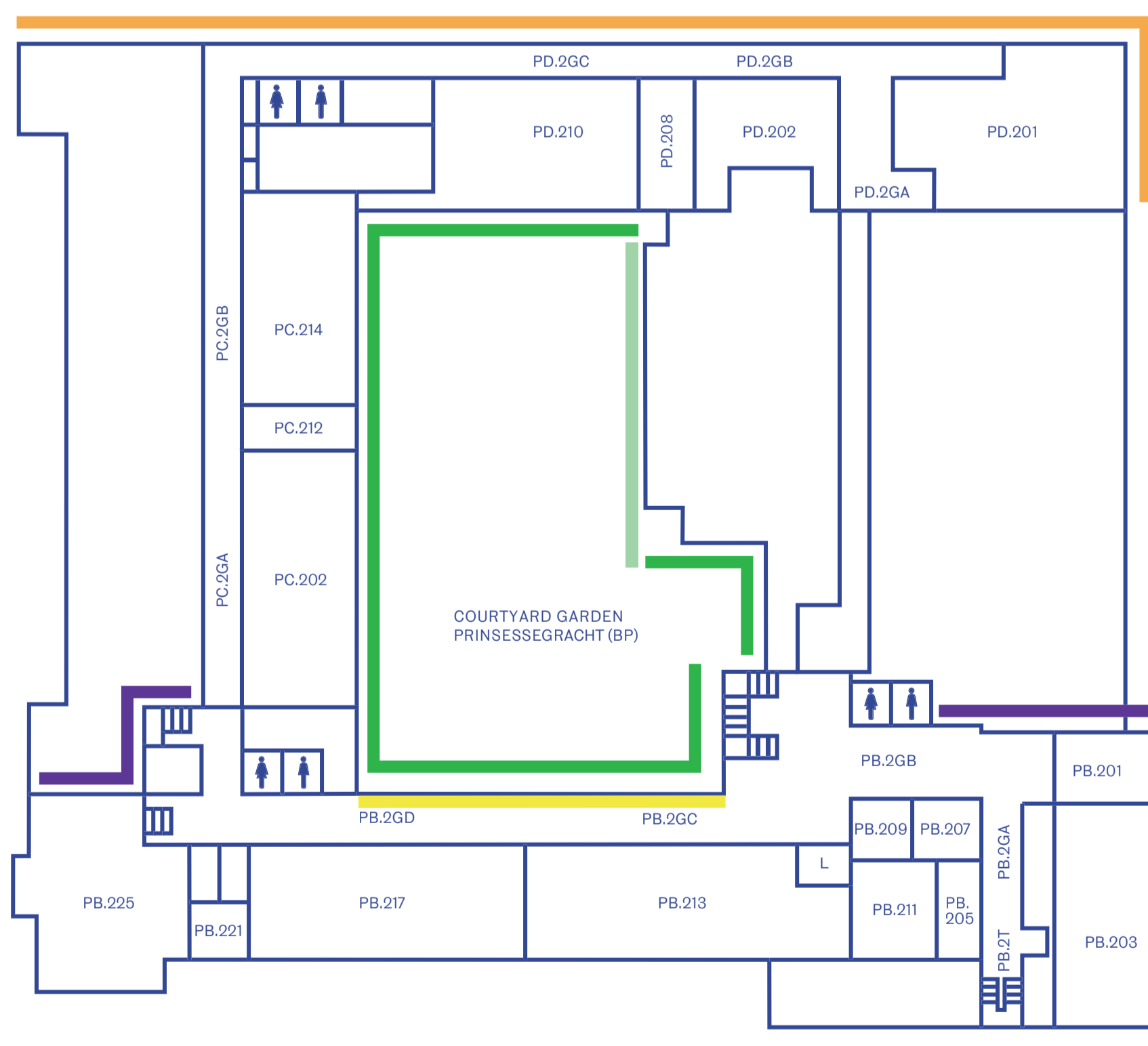
Ground floor
