
Statutory tuition fee: € 2060,-¹ / € 1030,-²

Collaboration / Research

The Master ArtScience is an unique interdisciplinary art programme between the Royal Academy of Art and the Royal Conservatoire and is (together with the Bachelor programme) therefore called the ArtScience Interfaculty. Participants in the Master programme are admitted on the basis of a research proposal. A personal coach will then assist in devising a study- and research plan that includes course modules, projects and labs offered within the ArtScience Interfaculty, the Academy as well as the Royal Conservatoire and Leiden University.

Input / Output

Due to the fact that ArtScience is a true interfaculty between Academy and Conservatoire, the department has an interdisciplinary focus that intersects the existing fields of music, visual art, media art and other artistic disciplines. A close collaboration with Leiden University's Media Technology programme helps to extend these intersections to the humanities and the natural sciences. The ArtScience staff originates from a variety of artistic cultures and disciplines and is unique in its scope. Nearly all courses are organised in the first semester, called 'Input'. These courses run in four tracks and follow an 'open curriculum': courses are usually accessible to students of all (Bachelor and Master) years. Some exceptions apply, and there is a selection of courses specifically focused on Master students. The second semester ('Output') is almost completely dedicated to the students' individual projects. Every Monday all students and teachers gather at the so-called Manic Mondays. Teachers are available for coaching, and other forms of sharing information (such as lectures, pop-up projects and other) can be organised.



Future / Professional

The programme considers art and science as a continuum and promotes the development of new art forms and artistic languages. The study stimulates students to question and reflect upon actual developments within the arts and sciences as well as technological and social developments. Students are challenged to shape future forms of art. The programme delivers students who find their way in the more experimental fields of the arts including media and interactive arts, electronic music and sound installations, but also performance arts, cinema or even literature.


